About the Speaker:

Dr. Michael J. Morgan is a graduate of the University of Illinois School of Dentistry in Chicago and presently maintains an esthetic-oriented restorative and wellness-centered practice in Hinsdale, Illinois. For the past decade, Dr. Morgan has been a facilitator and presenter for hands-on and live-patient treatment programs. He has been an instructor at the Las Vegas Institute for Advanced Dental Studies, as well as Co-Director of the Advanced Posterior Esthetics Program at The Pacific Aesthetics Continuum (PAC-live), University of the Pacific, San Francisco, California. Dr. Morgan is an active member of the American Academy of Cosmetic Dentistry, the American Dental Association, as well as an advisor and evaluator for new composite materials for several dental manufacturers. He has authored and co-authored numerous articles and lectured domestically and internationally on adhesive dentistry, composite techniques and digital photography. His particular passion in dentistry lies in the art of direct and indirect conservative esthetic resin restorations and techniques to make their use easier and more predictable.

The “Star Wars” of Dentistry

Description: Today's parents demand the restoration of their younger children's and teenager's teeth for function and esthetics. The self-image of our patients is very important. Glass ionomers, resinomers, composites, and various types of crowns will be illustrated and the chairside/laboratory steps necessary to produce them will be presented. Treatment planning of these restorations will be taught, as well as the proper tooth preparation and steps necessary to accomplish esthetic, long-lasting restorations. Esthetic space maintainers will be shown and the participants will learn the ease with which these can be fabricated. Enamel micro abrasion, direct-bonded composite and porcelain veneers will be shown as examples of conservative esthetic restorations for our teenage patients. Both traditional and Erbium Laser preparations will be illustrated. Using slides and videos, step-by-step procedures will be shown.

Course Objectives:

- Learn how to fabricate an open-faced stainless steel crown.
- Learn how to fabricate esthetic space maintainers with pontics.
- Learn the differences between various esthetic dental materials and their optimum utilization for our pediatric patients.
- Learn how to utilize micro abrasion, porcelain veneers, and other cosmetic restorations for our teenage patients
- Learn how lasers work and the various types of lasers used in dentistry.
- Learn how the Erbium Laser can be used for cavity preparations.
- Learn how the Erbium Laser can be used to perform soft tissue surgery.
- Learn how the Erbium Laser compares to the high-speed handpiece and air abrasion.

About the Speaker:

Dr. Fred Margolis received his B.S. and D.D.S. from Ohio State University and his certificate in pediatric dentistry from the University of Illinois College of Dentistry. Dr. Margolis is a Clinical Instructor at Loyola University's Oral Health Center and an Adjunct Clinical Assistant Professor at the University of Illinois College of Dentistry. He is a fellow of the Pierre Fauchard Academy, International College of Dentists, American College of Dentists, Academy of Dentistry International, and the Odontographic Society. He is the International Editor of the Alpha Omega Dental Fraternity publication. Dr. Margolis is director of the Institute for Advanced Dental Education and has lectured nationally and internationally. He has been a consultant to the ADA's Council on Dental Practice and an ADA Seminar Series Lecturer. He has Educator status in the Academy of Laser Dentistry and has received his Mastership certificate from the ALD. He is most proud of the "Distinguished Member of 2005" awarded by the Illinois State Dental Society. He was recently selected by *Dentistry Today Journal* as a "top clinician in continuing education for 2009". Restoratively Driven, Interdisciplinary Powered Treatment Planning:

A Protocol for Implant Success!

Description: Clinical success depends on many individual small steps. We should be both amazed and grateful when the results are better than expected! One wrong move by anyone on the team can jeopardize the desired result. Co-coordinating a dental team to be consistent, accurate, esthetic, punctual, and complimentary to each other is often left to chance. Unless you are doing it all (the surgery, laboratory fabrication, and delivery of each case), there is a need for accurate communication to and by everyone involved. Of all available options, the best person to quarterback the team is the restorative dentist. The forming of interdisciplinary teams will be outlined. Methods of communication between team members will be evaluated. Case studies will aid in enhancing diagnostic/treatment/communication skills from the "bread and butter" single implant to full mouth reconstruction. Throughout the presentation, evidence based literature will support the protocol.
