

PROTOCOL PRESENTATIONS

Each Master Track session includes 20 hours of lecture/participation. A protocol assignment is made for each session to be completed on your patient in your office between sessions. To receive an additional 28 hours you will be required to attend the next Master Track session and give a PowerPoint presentation of no more than 10 minutes. To help you prepare, please refer to the checklist below. Your case study should include the following, where applicable:

- Digital version of full mouth x-rays, preoperative and of treatment progress. (If you don't have digital copies, bring the hard copies to your presentation.)
- Preoperative dental charting
- Digital photographs: preoperative, treatment progress, and similar treated cases
- Mounted treatment casts of treatment progress and postoperative (if indicated)
- Preoperative medical/dental histories
- Patient consent/release form for treatment
- Patient consent/release form to use digital photos in presentation.
- Explanation of materials and methods used for treatment.
- Any other information influencing treatment and outcome of the cases.
- A written discussion of each case from beginning to completion so that the full scope can be understood by anyone who is not present at the oral presentation. Each description should be 1-3 pages in length. A short conclusion should be included in your Power Point presentation.
- A resources page listing all books and people you gathered information from for your presentation.
- Bring all supporting documentation with you. It will be on display during your presentation for other participants to examine.

Your PowerPoint presentation might not include all of the above items but documentation is required. For example, keep copies of your consent forms in your records but don't include them in your oral presentation.
