ABOUT THE PROGRAM

The advent, evolution, and application of dental implants has been ongoing for many years, perhaps even centuries. The modern dental implant is built on that foundation and now offers a predictable and permanent solution for many patients to replace missing dentition. This program will follow that evolution and give attendees a broad base of knowledge to apply to their own practice and their own patients. Using the literature as a basis, real world patient case studies will be presented that tie the art to the science and will allow practitioners to apply those same principles into their practices immediately.

FRIDAY, SEPTEMBER 16

Day one will include an introduction to dental implants. What are dental implants, what is osseointegration and why does it work? Why does it sometimes not work? What patients can have dental implants and which patients should not have dental implants? What are the biological factors that we need to consider? What are the mechanical properties of the implant that we need to consider? How are the biological and mechanical principles critically related to each other for long-term success? Treatment planning concepts will be discussed that take into account the needs of each individual patient. Pre-implant or pre-prosthetic needs will have to be addressed to include spacing considerations, along with endodontic, orthodontic, and assessment of the available space and the bone volume. Bone grafting will be discussed from the restorative perspective; what types of bone graft are available, what works, what works best? An introduction to soft tissue management will also be included.

SATURDAY, SEPTEMBER 17

Implant esthetics will follow a discussion of general esthetic principles and considerations. In what Dr. Ludens calls “the Big 5”, soft tissue management will be discussed in detail and the concept will be discussed in detail from all of the ways that patients present themselves to our practice.

THE BIG 5

1. Tooth is missing - implant placement, delayed provisional fabrication
2. Tooth is missing - implant placement, immediate provisional fabrication
3. Tooth is present - extraction with bone preservation
4. Tooth is present - extraction, immediate implant placement, delayed provisional fabrication
5. Tooth is present - extraction, immediate implant placement, immediate provisional fabrication

Impression techniques and impression materials, including conventional and digital impressions will be discussed. Each will be discussed from start to finish with a discussion of tips and techniques to improve your esthetic outcomes in your own practice.

Multiple units with pontic site development will be discussed and shown that build on the Big 5 for patient cases that require multiple implant restoration.

Insertion, maintenance, hygiene and recall protocols will be discussed.

SUNDAY, SEPTEMBER 18

Lecture and Hands-On Program This session will discuss the workflow, both conventional and digital. A discussion of occlusion as it relates to implants will be discussed, along with a discussion on the differences between the natural dentition and dental implants, particularly as it relates to a “mixed” dentition of natural teeth and implants.

Complications will be discussed in detail in the hope that complications will be minimized or can be more easily managed. Complications can be random events, but they can also be “self-inflicted” unwittingly by the practitioner in their choice of restorative techniques, materials, and components. Using and selecting the proper components and materials is critical to long-term success and an in-depth discussion will be shown on how to make the proper application of technique and proper selection and use of components. What happens when those choices are made incorrectly and the complications they can cause will be discussed in depth.

This session will include a hands-on session, where attendees will fabricate a provisional restoration along with a custom impression coping. Feedback will be direct and supportive throughout that session.
