Dr. Stanley Malamed

Stanley F. Malamed is a dentist anesthesiologist and emeritus professor of dentistry at the Herman Ostrow School of Dentistry, located in Los Angeles, California, USA. In 1973, Professor Malamed joined the

faculty of the University of



Southern California School of Dentistry (now the Herman Ostrow School of Dentistry of U.S.C). Dr. Malamed retired from full-time teaching at the university in 2013.

Doctor Malamed has authored more than 170 scientific papers and 17 chapters in various medical and dental journals and textbooks in the areas of physical evaluation, emergency medicine, local anesthesia, sedation and general anesthesia. In addition, Dr. Malamed is the author of three widely used textbooks, published by CV Mosby: Handbook of Medical Emergencies in the Dental Office (8th edition 2022); Handbook of Local Anesthesia (7th edition 2020); and Sedation – a guide to patient management (6th edition 2017) and two interactive DVD's:

Emergency Medicine (3rd edition, 2018) and Malamed's Local Anesthetic

Technique DVD (2004) (edition 2 - 2012). The textbooks have been translated into 22 foreign-language editions.

Dr. Jeffrey Okeson

Dr. Okeson is Professor and Dean of the University of Kentucky College of Dentistry. He founded in the College's Orofacial Pain Program in 1977. Dr. Okeson has more than 240 publications in the area of occlusion,



TM disorders and orofacial pain in various national and international journals. The eight edition of Dr. Okeson's textbook *Management of Temporomandibular Disorders and Occlusion* is published by Elsevier Publishers. This text is used in most of the United States dental schools as well as in many other countries. It has been translated into twelve different foreign languages. In addition to this text, Dr. Okeson has authored the seventh edition of *Bell's Oral and Facial Pains* which is published by Quintessence Publishing Company and widely used in orofacial pain programs throughout the world.

Dr. Okeson is an active member of many TMD and orofacial pain organizations holding many offices and serving on numerous committees and boards. He is a past President of the American Academy of Orofacial Pain and former editor of the Academy's Guidelines. He is a founding Diplomate of the American Board of Orofacial Pain and has serviced twice as President. Dr. Okeson is a very sought after lecturer on the subject of TMD and orofacial pain and has presented more than 1300 invited lectures on the subject of TMD and orofacial pain in all 50 states and in 59 different countries. He has received numerous teaching awards including "The International Dentist of the Year Award" from the Academy of Dentistry International. This is the highest award recognized by this Academy and was given to him in recognition of his worldwide efforts in providing education in the area of temporomandibular disorders and orofacial pain.

THE RENAISSANCE OF LOCAL ANESTHESIA

FRIDAY, OCTOBER 27, 2023 8:00 AM TO 5:00 PM

Local anesthesia forms the backbone of pain control techniques in contemporary dental practice. The subject of pain control in dentistry has recently undergone a renewal of interest, a renaissance of sorts. In this program Doctor Malamed will present an in-depth look at many aspects of this important area of daily dental practice.

In the morning session, we will look at dentistry's most important drugs – local anesthetics, reviewing the clinical differences amongst them and the significant advantages of dentistry's newest local anesthetic – articaine. Buffering of local anesthetics and reversing local anesthesia are also discussed. Local anesthetic systemic toxicity (LAST) (also known as 'overdose' will be discussed in the AM session as well.

The afternoon session looks at techniques, both maxillary and mandibular. Emphasis will be placed on the mandible as the traditional inferior alveolar nerve block (NB) has a depressing low success rate. Alternative approaches to effective mandibular anesthesia will be reviewed, including the Gow-Gates mandibular NB, PDL, Intraosseous anesthesia, the use of articaine by mandibular infiltration, and buffered local anesthetics. The question to be answered is: "Is the Mandibular Block Passé?"

Temporomandibular disorders (TMD) are a group of musculoskeletal disorders of the masticatory system. These disorders are common, and dentists are the primary care providers. Therefore, every dentist should have a sound understanding of TMD so that the most appropriate care will be selected for the patient. Often simple care can make big differences in the patient's quality of life. This presentation will describe the present evidence that helps guide the clinician to best treatment for TMD. Attempts will be made to separate the facts from the fantasies in the area of TMD.

What You Will Learn:

- To identify those pain disorders that will likely respond to your therapy from those that will not.
- How to differentiate TMD from other sources of orofacial pain.
- The relationship between occlusion and temporomandibular disorders.
- The relationship between bruxism and muscle pain.
- The most favorable orthopedically stable relationship between the occlusion and condylar position for orthodontic prosthodontic and therapy.
- The appropriate use of occlusal appliance therapy for muscle pain and joint pain.
- When an occlusal appliance reduces the patient's TMD symptoms, what do you next?
- When to consider referring the TMD patient to another health care provider.
