Interested to know which Nevada legislators voted in favor of dental therapists in 2019?

Studying for the AGD Fellowship Exam

I have been an AGD member since graduating from dental school. I did a GPR and started working at a public health clinic in Northern Nevada. Many of my teachers were Fellows of the AGD, and I learned early the advantages of being dedicated to CE and working towards the distinction of AGD awards. As I was far from earning the 500 CE credits, my sights were not immediately on the fellowship exam. But this year, I finally researched the exam, and to my surprise I could have taken the exam from the beginning. It has been six years since dental school, and now I realize it is recommended to take the exam as soon after school as is permitted.

I decided to take the comprehensive <u>Fellowship Review Course</u> and I also used the <u>AGD Study Guide Materials</u> to refresh my memory. However, several of the instructors recommended studying the Part 2 Dental Decks. I used the comments for each question to learn more about the thought process and focused on the questions I got wrong.

I was fairly nervous going into the exam and wasn't sure what to expect. The exam seemed focused on multifaceted thinking questions based on material, procedures, clinical judgment, and general medical knowledge and weaving them together. And yes, it reminded me a lot of the Part 2 Boards.

Recommendations:

- 1. Take the Fellowship Exams as soon after dental school as possible.
- 2. Study Part 2 Dental Decks
- 3. Use the AGD Study Materials
