Subject: Availability of PPE for Dentists Performing Emergency Procedures

The Academy of General Dentistry (AGD) appreciates the extraordinary challenges you, as Governors, are facing during this unprecedented pandemic. AGD members are general dentists who provide the full range of dental care to patients. Our 39,000 members recognize the importance of prioritizing stopping the spread of COVID-19 and assuring that front line health care workers have personal protective equipment (PPE) needed to protect themselves and avoid spreading the virus.

To decrease the number of patients presenting in over-burdened hospital emergency rooms, dental offices should remain available for treatment of dental emergencies. To safely and effectively treat patients with severe tooth pain, bleeding, swelling, trauma and/or infections, dentists must have the PPE required to protect their staff as well as patients.

As with all healthcare workers, dentists and staff who provide emergency dental treatment place themselves at risk for acquiring the virus. It is believed that COVID-19 has an aerosol half-life of 1.1 hours. Most dental procedures create an aerosol, which requires the use of proper PPE.

At present, dentists are unable to obtain much needed PPE such as N95 masks and face shields, and are utilizing their existing supplies of PPE in order to treat emergency patients. Despite judicious use, these existing supplies are alarmingly low. Dentists who remain available for patients seeking care for severe pain, trauma, bleeding, swelling and/or infection should not be required to relinquish PPE.

Across the country, general dentists continue to work with our specialists' partners ensuring patients are properly triaged and rendered free from severe pain and infection. They are following the CDC Interim Infection Prevention and Control Guidance for Dental Settings During the COVID-19 Response. This willingness to remain available to treat urgent dental problems significantly decreases the burden in hospital emergency rooms and allows our medical colleagues to focus on exigent medical issues.

Dental facilities must be able to provide critical, emergent care. Additionally, all emergency surgical, invasive dental procedures should be performed without delay, thereby avoiding potential complications that could lead to hospitalization. In accordance with the CDC, the urgency of a procedure is a decision based on clinical judgment and should be made on a case-by-case basis.

The AGD recognizes that in the current crisis, a Governor may need to take measures to control the distribution of available PPE for workers on the front lines. We ask that you work with appropriate agencies to balance requirements of our front-line medical personnel with the needs of dental personnel who are providing emergency dental care with access to the necessary PPE.
